School Council

We're sure some of you will have seen School Council out on traffic patrols before and after school this week- the children feel very passionately about keeping our school community, and everyone in it, as safe as we can.

The children were giving out our own 'fixed penalty' notices they had designed. If you received one, we ask you to consider why, and how you could park more safely in future. Parking on the yellow SCHOOL markings, zig zags, double yellow lines, on the pavement and within 6 metres of a junction, were all mistakes we saw many times!
