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Headteacher News

I have played and continue to play a whole range of sports but I don't have a lot of interest in watching football and don't support a team. Don't get me wrong, I love having a kick-around with a ball but I'm just not into watching it. Football's dominance globally though is obvious. By far in a way the most popular sport worldwide, it is followed by around four billion people on this planet and it enjoys particular popularity in Europe (where it is as much a way of life as a game for many). This is perhaps because it's so accessible; there's probably very few people who haven't kicked a ball at some point in their lives. As we all know though, the game has an ugly side to it; partly in the ethically questionable money that it commands at high level but, more troublingly, in the violence that is sometimes witnessed before, during and after fixtures. I'm conscious that our offer of showing the England-Wales match divided parents.

For our part, we've become increasingly conscious of the need to enable children to experience key events taking place either in or pertaining to Britain. As of November 2014, schools must now promote British values. These 'fundamental British values' are; democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and the mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith. And with the emergence of this new expectation upon schools, we have widened this to try to instil a feeling of 'being British'; of considering the habits, behaviours, or symbols that have a common, familiar or iconic quality that is instantly identifiable with Britain. Part of this is providing opportunities to celebrate and experience significant national events, which has recently seen us screening Tim Peake's high-profile launch into space as the first British, European Space Agency Astronaut, and also the Queen's 90th birthday celebrations. This week, it saw us screening the England-Wales match; an internal British football rivalry that goes back to around 1879. The relationship between the Welsh and English is mostly characterised by tolerance, respect, and an intermixing of people and cultures, with a healthy competitive rivalry being a natural part of this. With the end of the Home Nations Football Championship in 1984 (which saw the teams go head-to-head annually) England-Wales encounters have become a rarity and this was therefore one of the standout games of the Euro 2016 group stages. So, as part of our celebration and education of being British and of competitive sports, it seemed appropriate to screen the match.

Of course we'll be selective regarding what we choose to focus valuable curriculum time on in school and we won't be screening every sporting event that takes place throughout the year but we will continue to selectively choose appropriate British events to cover. By all accounts the atmosphere as the children watched the match was electric: they were certainly buzzing as they left school. Dismissing so many pupils after such events is still something that we haven't quite nailed and I must apologise that we're yet to work out an efficient procedure for doing this. We're learning each time and we will get there. Have a great weekend!


Year 5 News
