Heads News

Lost Property

MOST IMPORTANTLY please make sure your child's uniform is clearly labelled with their full name and class which will help keep them united and avoid extra expense to you.

Year 1 News

Well done to all the Year 1 children who have settled into their classes this term. We shall be running a "meet the teaching team" on Wednesday 16th September in the children's classrooms at 5:00. This is an opportunity to meet the teams teaching your children and to find out information about learning within Year 1. Don't forget that on Friday the 18th September the children and Year 1 team will all be dressed up for our "Superhero Day".

Illness

The school should be notified on the first day of absence, for whatever reason, for a child's absence. We are charged by legislation to show the number of absences from school for the preceding academic year and these will be included on your child's annual report. All absences must be accounted for by letter, telephone or in person. Please expect a call/text from one of our Administrators if we do not receive a call explaining the absence first thing on that first day. There is a dedicated absence answer-phone so messages can be left 24 hours a day.

If your child has had diarrhoea or has been vomiting in the past 24 hours, please keep him/her at home until the child has been symptom-free for 48 hours.

If your child is experiencing itchy, watery eyes (often symptoms of conjunctivitis), please keep your child home until the condition has improved (no pus or crusting) and treatment has begun.

If your child exhibits an unexplained skin rash, again please keep your child home until the condition has been evaluated and treated. E.g. impetigo - lesions must be crusted or healed, no wetness or pus. For chickenpox – all blisters must be crusted; period of exclusion from school is a minimum of 5 days from the onset of the rash.

Dentist & Doctor's Appointments

Can we ask parents that, except in an emergency, all doctor and dentist appointments are made outside of school hours. In the event that this is not possible, then children should be collected from school as near to the appointment time as possible and then returned back to school straight afterwards. If the medical appointment is during the school day, evidence must be provided. A whole days absence is not deemed necessary for a medical appointment that occurs in the morning – the child would be expected to return to school in the afternoon, and vice versa.

If children do not attend school regularly, they may not be able to keep up with school work. In a busy school day it is difficult for schools to find the extra time to help a child catch up. It's not only the academic work: missing out on the social side of school life can affect children's ability to make and keep friendships, a vital part of growing up. Setting good attendance patterns from an early age, from nursery classes through primary school, will also help your child later on. Being on time is also vital. Arriving late at school can be very disruptive for your child, the teacher, and the other children in the class.

Meerkats - Family Separation Support.

Jane Gilbert (Parent Support Advisor) and Julie Spencer (Learning Mentor) will be running a support group for children who have experienced separation within their family. The aim of the group is to give the children an opportunity to talk about their feelings, understand their emotions and develop coping strategies. The program will run for 6 weeks during this term and each session will have a play based activity, allowing children to have fun in a relaxed safe environment.
