Headteacher's News

Governors and I recently met with representatives of Plymouth's Electoral Services in order to discuss the use of Montpelier as a Polling Station. Plymouth had requested the use of our school for local election polling on 3rd May 2018, which would have required a school closure. However, we have now successfully negotiated a greater level of commitment from PCC in order to avoid this closure. For this coming election, Electoral Services will provide additional polling staff to prevent unauthorised entry into the school, two security staff on our front entry gates to ensure voters don't access the site at the start and end of the school day, improved signage for the polling station so voters know exactly where to go, and the correct front entrance address details on the poll cards. This means that we do not have to close the school on 3rd May. Furthermore, during 2018, Electoral Services will review the polling districts and polling places with a view to finding an alternative to using Montpelier in the future. This is great news as we are all very aware of the impact on pupils' learning from school closure and the inconvenience and cost to parents.

So, to start, March's Craze of the Month are Top trump cards, a teddy, jacks, or a skipping rope.


