What a fantastic week we have had in Foundation. We have enjoyed sharing our toys at the Toy and Gift Assembly, continuing to learn about the importance of helping others - we really enjoyed singing some Christmas songs too!

In Phonics this week, Len has introduced 4 new sounds to us: **j, v, w and x**. The children have also learnt three new tricky words. Tricky words cannot be sounded out and are words we have to remember by sight. This week we have learned **he, she and we**.

Can you practice writing these words at home using the correct letter formation? Can you segment each word for spelling? Can you think of other words using those sounds? Remember that writing these words and practising the sounds does not just have to be on paper - it can be in bubbles in the bath, mud, sand - anywhere you can think of!

We have also been learning to write rhyming captions using finger spaces and a capital letter. Can you write:

The cat sat on the mat.
