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Headteacher News

Tests. Successive government have felt that these are an important part of children's schooling. They would argue that part of their role is to inform teacher assessments of a pupil's abilities – how well they have learned knew knowledge and skills. And, in truth, there is a place for testing for exactly this reason; to combine with other evidence that teacher's gather throughout the year in order to assess their learning. However, one key area that the Department for Education (DfE) would argue that tests are for is accountability. To hold schools to account for their performance in terms of the academic success of their pupils. Recently, the DfE has changed the system of testing. Made it harder – 'raised the bar' as they call it. There is a more challenging new curriculum and far more demanding tests too. I thought it might be worth you seeing just how challenging they are now so I'll include various questions over the next few weeks as examples. Have a go! How about this one for starters. It comes from a DfE example of a Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling test that children will take in Year 6.

Tick one box in each row to show if the underlined conjunction is a **subordinating conjunction** or a **co-ordinating conjunction**.

Sentence	Subordinating conjunction	Co-ordinating conjunction
I like ice-skating and roller-skating.		
Jamie likes roller-skating, but he has never tried ice-skating.		
Jamie will go ice-skating if I go with him.		

It is one of 49 questions they will have to attempt to answer in 45 minutes. If you know your conjunctions then I guess it's relatively straight forward but children will also need to know about (amongst other things) prefixes, suffixes, contractions, use of apostrophes, pronouns, relative clauses, subordinating clauses, modal verbs, synonyms, antonyms, past progressive, prepositions, subjunctive form, determiners, possessive pronouns, etc. The heat is on as they say and well and truly turned up. Although these are Year 6 tests, every class throughout the school will be focussing more on teaching children these complex grammar rules. So when you next hear about tougher tests, you'll know that they mean it!

Netball club after school have now come to an end. This will continue in the New Year.


Music News
