

# Deputy Headteacher News Current Affairs – British Values

The deadly attacks in France on Friday 13th November left schools and parents around the world grappling with what to say to children, and how to say it. When our children returned to school this week, many of our teachers struggled to decide whether to discuss what happened in Paris. I'm sure many of you, our parents wondered whether to talk about the violence or how to explain it. From country to country, the topic was tackled in different, and similar, ways. As a school we joined the rest of our country in a moment of silence, standing alongside France to show our support and to honour the hundreds of people who were killed or injured while out simply enjoying a Friday evening.

Under the current framework the promotion of British values is a key driver in our everyday curriculum and it is important to remember that British values essentially are the cornerstones that individual who live in Britain adhere too. The language we hear from government is of 'promoting fundamental British values' and of young people 'accepting', 'respecting' and 'tolerating'. These are values that we have and will continue to promote and encourage at Montpelier. At this time it should also be remembered that these values are shared with many other countries across our world and that this has been evident as this past week has unfolded.

## **Social Media Accounts**

As you all know the past week is nationally recognised as Anti-Bullying Week. The children have been learning about what bullying is and how we can work together to eliminate it. The children do have an understanding that bullying takes many forms and are aware that it is especially prevalent online in society today. From conversations with the children, parents and colleagues it has become increasingly evident that a number of children at our school have social media accounts. I would like to bring to your attention that the minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, and Snapchat is 13. YouTube requires account holders to be 18, but a 13-year-old can sign up with a parent's permission. This is to create an environment that protects children from data tracking and 13 is generally considered to be the age when children start developing a broader understanding of the world around them and, along with that, a better sense of what's appropriate to share online.

# Headlice -They're back!

The most common places for headlice to lurk are in the hair behind your ears and at the nape of your neck.

If you still can't spot any lice, comb the child's hair with a special 'nit comb'. These are available from most chemists. It's easier to spot the dark brown headlice as they fall out if you comb the hair over a piece of white paper.

Now you need to treat your child. Headlice are tough – they can't be killed by washing with normal shampoo or normal combing. Because they reproduce so quickly, you've got to kill them before they spread. If your child has headlice, check everyone in the family. You'll need to treat everyone affected to get rid of them.
