This week the children have embraced learning about kindness, helping and remembering others. We were so proud of them for joining the whole school in our Remembrance Service and we had a super day talking about those who help to protect our country. Each class painted a poppy mural and we talked about the poppy as a symbol of remembrance.

We have also joined in with anti-bullying week this week and our text of the week has been the Three Little Pigs. We spoke about which character was unkind and why, sharing ideas of why we need to be kind and look after others. Whilst wearing odd socks, we spoke about what makes us all different and that it is so special - it is brilliant to be different and like different things, have different hobbies and friends.

To finish the week we have had the most amazing day celebrating Children in Need. On Thursday our group time was spent talking about Pudsey (can you believe he visited us on Wednesday?) and how he helps to raise money for boys and girls who aren't as lucky as we are. We talked about what 'Charity' meant and how we raise money to help others less fortunate. On Friday we joined in with 'Joe Wicks Live Workout' and judged the cakes in the children's bake off - everyone looked amazing in their wacky sporty gear. On Friday we also had an exciting Maths Money Workshop led by Natwest Bank who came in to talk to children about the value of coins, what we might spend our money on and how we could save it.



This week in Phonics we have finished Phase 2 and have had a whole Phase recap week. Next week we will start Phase 3 - how exciting! In Maths Meg has been teaching us how to combine the total of two groups by counting altogether and also we have been learning about positional language.
