School Games – Personal Challenge – Week 2




How many times can you throw and catch a ball in 30 seconds?

Cardboard Boat Race 2018

On Saturday 15th September, Year 6 took part in an exciting 'Cardboard Boat Race' on the Plymouth Barbican. The race involved making a boat out of cardboard and rowing it 400 metres across the harbour to the Mayflower Steps. The boat race is one of the main events of Plymouth's Ocean City Festival and was organised by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers. In July 32 children in Year 5 learned how boats are constructed and then eight children had the opportunity to create the Cardboard Boat showing great teamwork.

The Year 6 boat crew showed fantastic teamwork and behaviour. They did not capsize or sink (unlike some of the contestants) and made it safely to the Mayflower Steps in an impressive 7 minutes and 13 seconds. The team were in 5th place overall out of 8 teams in the Primary School category. Congratulations to the Year 6 racing crew.
