Zak Morgan, our super site manager, is on the case preparing the chicken run and our new hen house has arrived. We are expecting our chickens after Easter and we will then provide the training for all the families who have volunteered to help look after them. Our tortoise should be arriving just after Easter too. Finally, you may have seen in the news this week that schools school dogs are being recognised in helping with supporting mental health. We are already ahead of the game! In June I am attending a course run by a charity who are experienced in supporting schools who wish to have a dog so that I can give this serious consideration and see if this is something that we can manage. So along with the guinea pigs and the stick insects there are lots of opportunities for all our children to interact with animals. We know that the more life experiences our children have the stronger their learning.

You may have also seen in the news recently the pressure that remains on school budgets, with some schools having to close their doors early on a Friday as they are unable to afford the staffing and other schools requesting that pupils come to school with their own equipment. While at Montpelier we are trying to manage with tighter budgets, as a school we are not in a position that we need to do that. However, we are always having to review what we do and make tough decisions about where to spend the money we do have, just as we do as families at home. 
