#### **Headteacher News**

The end of the first autumn term. It's been a very busy time – lots has been happening. Our Foundation Stage team have been working hard to introduce a new electronic way of recording pupil's learning journeys (Tapestry) which aims to keep parents more involved in their child's experiences in school by making much of what they do accessible online. They have also been undertaking a completely new baseline assessment system within a much shorter time frame than usual, in line with new government expectations. All of our Key Stage 1 and 2 staff have been getting to grips with an entirely new national curriculum, one which focusses heavily on learning more complex skills earlier, particularly in English and mathematics. Alongside this, they have also been getting used to a completely new way of assessing and tracking pupils in accordance with the new national curriculum objectives. Staff have also introduced new Learning Journey books throughout the school which replaces the separate books we had for each subject. Every time a child writes, no matter which subject, they will write in these Learning Journeys, with the exception of their English Progress pieces and their mathematics. You'll have an opportunity to look through these during the parent-teacher consultations in November. We've also launched eSchools which has required teachers to familiarise themselves with a new system of informing parents about learning and setting homework electronically. We've also been introducing the idea of Golden Learning Behaviours to sit alongside our 'Going for Gold' behaviour policy. The celebration of Golden Learning Behaviours is all about identifying and encouraging appropriate learning behaviours in children (such as planning, persevering, questioning, imagining, reasoning, collaborating) and overtly focussing on these with the idea that children can learn to become better learners. This is an initiative that we will continue to drive forward throughout this academic year. It's not about learning a particular subject as such, it all about learning to be better at learning across all subjects. So, as a school, we've had lots of new things to take on board, so we're rather pleased to have a break coming up! We're also looking forward to meeting parents directly following our return after the autumn break. I hope everyone is finding the new eSchools online booking process for the consultations easy and trouble free. As I've mentioned before; any feedback regarding eSchools will be gratefully received.
