Armistice Day, held on November 11th every year, commemorates the signing of the armistice between the Allies and Germany at 11am on 11th November 1918. Although hostilities continued in some areas, the armistice essentially brought an end to four years of fighting in the First World War.

Great Britain still believes strongly in remembering those who fought not only in World Wars, but the more than 12,000 British Servicemen and women killed or injured since 1945. The act of Remembrance rightly has a place in and impact on our lives, no matter which day of the week it might fall upon. The most important thing from our school perspective is that the memory of those who have given their lives and continue to serve our country to preserve the free world that we live in are remembered for many generations to come.

The sight of the poppy and the reason we wear is something the children of Montpelier Primary School understand, have respect for and will honour for many years to come.
