Becoming an Academy

When the children return to school on Monday, we will officially be an academy. There have been a number of delays to the process; all extremely boring but important things such as transfer of lease agreements, contracts and outstanding building maintenance issues. Also, due to the sheer number of schools converting to academy status in Plymouth at the moment, many are facing such delays. But I won't bore you with the details, suffice to say I received confirmation in writing from the Secretary of State yesterday. As I have previously mentioned though, there will be no fanfares, no change of name, logo or uniform. Nothing. Or at least nothing that you'll directly notice. As an academy we will be a member of the Inspiring Schools Partnership MAT (Multi-Academy Trust) which consists of Montpelier Primary, Stoke Damerel Community College (SDCC) and Scott Medical and Health College. Over the coming months and years other local schools may well join this MAT to partner with us. Fundamentally and simply, becoming an academy means that we are independent of Plymouth City Council (our Local Authority) and we receive our funding directly from central government now rather than through PCC. The day-to-day running of the school remains with the Headteacher, who is now overseen by the ISP Multi-Academy Trust (which is a charitable organisation). The ISP provides advice, support, expertise and a strategic overview. And, in essence, we have more freedom than local authority maintained schools to change and innovate practice.

We have opted to work more closely with SDCC because evidence tells us that when we work with secondary colleagues, the transition between Key Stage 2 (end of primary curriculum) and Key Stage 3 (start of secondary curriculum) is a more natural step. We can learn a lot from each other; how we do things, how we teach and organise ourselves, and this will only strengthen the experience for our pupils as they move on. This doesn't mean to say that we expect our Year 6 pupils to naturally move on to SDCC – currently we feed to around 14 different secondary schools each year but by far the biggest proportion go to SDCC which makes them our natural partner. What we learn from working more closely with SDCC will also benefit how we work with all of our other secondary colleagues. Our focus has, and always will be, what is best for the children at Montpelier Primary School now and in the future. Working with a small number of partner schools in a close geographical location to us will enable us to share good practice easily and make best use of resources. A local solution for our local community.

So, although you won't notice any discernible differences immediately, over time our practice will change and improve (as it always does) as a result of us becoming an academy and joining the ISP MAT. If anyone has any questions regarding our conversion, you know where to find me! I'm more than happy to discuss and expand on any of this.

School Games

Cvclina - On Wednesday eight children across Years 5 and 6 competed at a 'Go-Ride' event at Hele's School.
