#### **Deputy Headteacher News**

I would like to say how lovely it was to see so many parents attend the parent–teacher consultations this week. Your involvement in your child's education is so important to both us and your children that I thought I'd mention it here. Being a parent myself I am aware that having quality time to talk to your child's teacher is so important. I would also like to take this time to remind parents that we do operate an open door policy at Montpelier and welcome parents into our school at every opportunity. I appreciate that in recent newsletters I have talked about our security procedures, but I would like to stress that these are purely there to keep your children safe and not you as parents out! The staff that we have are willing to meet with you at any time, either at the end of the day or through a pre-arranged appointment and I would encourage parents to keep the lines of communication open as it is something that we value very much.

This week I have had the privilege of accompanying two groups of children to activities and events at Plymouth Argyle Football Club. The children that attended were a credit to the school. The first activity was connected to leadership. Throughout this academic year a small group of children have been working alongside coaches from Argyle to become official sports leaders. At this point I have to say thank you to our learning mentor Julie Spencer, who has taken the time to organise and arrange this fantastic opportunity for the children at our school. Part of the course involved visiting the football club for an official tour and this took place on Wednesday of this week. The second event took place on Thursday and was all about raising the issue of racism and the impact it can have on anyone's life. **Show Racism the Red Card** is a national initiative being promoted with the help of football clubs throughout the country. The children took part in workshops, answered questions, watched and analysed short films and had the opportunity to listen to people who had been affected by racism during their lives. It was an informative and educational day and one that I know the children enjoyed.
