Going for Gold

The school has an established behaviour policy and children are aware of the expectations placed upon them. I have been informed that 15 months ago Montpelier introduced the gold system for rewarding positive behaviour. The children are engaged and motivated by this and as you are all aware significant achievements are rewarded and celebrated. I am aware that letters have been sent home accompanying a certificate that has been awarded. Initially, this was put in place to promote and inform parents of achievements and to encourage celebration of this success at home. Now that the system is established, and part of the everyday make up of life at Montpelier, the decision has been made to only continue to praise individuals with the certificate they receive in celebration assembly. In short, no letter will accompany a Going for Gold certificate, we will leave it up to the children to inform you of their achievements when they bring the certificate home.

Children's University Wildlife Ramble

Join our local Children's University for this wildlife ramble at Ford Park Cemetery on Saturday 19th September 2015. The walk, led by John Boon, Chairman of the Ford Park Cemetery Trust, starts at 10am and runs for an hour and a half. It's for young people aged five to 14 years (all children aged 11 and under must be accompanied by an adult). Meet outside the Visitor Centre car park in the cemetery grounds (free car parking spaces available).

The Children's University is a national initiative, which is run locally by Plymouth City Council with the help of local organisations.

Children can go to different learning lectures and activities outside of school hours through the programme. For every event they attend, they get time stamped into their learning passports, which they save up to earn bronze, silver and gold certificates.

They are presented with their qualifications at a 'graduation ceremony' held annually to celebrate their achievements. Learning passports can be bought for £3 at the lecture, from participating schools or from any Plymouth City Council library.

Children's University Graduation Ceremony

The Children's University 2015 Graduation Ceremony will be held on the evening of Monday 9th November in the Theatre Royal, Plymouth. To make sure that any child whom has accumulated at least 100 hours of learning or more receive their invitation please bring passports to school for the attention of Jane Gilbert before September 25th. Hours up to and including the closing date of 25th September will determine the category that the graduate will be placed in at the graduation.

Children, who attended the 2014 graduation ceremony, last year, may receive an invitation this year to recognise additional hours.
