Helicopter Visit

Whatever your thoughts on armed conflict and the requirement for nations to have a military, Plymouth's historic association to such things cannot be denied. Its naval connections go back a long way, with perhaps the most famous being the departure of Sir Francis Drake from the city to defeat the Spanish Armada in 1588. The first Royal dockyard opened on the banks of the Tamar, west of Plymouth, in 1691, and a number of other docks were established in the decades that followed. A massive naval complex came next which played a pivotal role in the war against Napoleon's France. Plymouth Dock, as it was known, became 'Devonport' in 1824. Between 1883 and the start of the First World War (1914), Devonport built 17 battleships, 5 dreadnoughts, 2 battlecruisers and 14 cruisers. More recently, Plymouth became one of the most heavily bombed cities in the country during WWII. Nevertheless, the city made a huge naval contribution to the war, with ships taking part in the Battle of the Atlantic and the D-Day landings. The docks also played a role in the Falklands Conflict of 1982.

Plymouth Armed Forces Day is an annual event to commemorate and say a huge 'Thank You' to the British Armed Forces community and celebrate the contribution it makes to our country. It takes place this year on Saturday 24th June on the Hoe between 10:00am and 10:30pm and will provide a spectacular and exciting day of entertainment with an air display, parade, demonstrations, evening concert and activities for the whole family. During the event, the Royal Navy, Army, RAF, Royal Marines and Veterans' organisations, charities and the Emergency Services will showcase their services in a variety of 'villages' set out across the Hoe. The day is a great opportunity for people to show their support for the men and women who make up the Armed Forces community.

We have a number of service families at Montpelier and always look to support them in any way that we can. Now one of them is about to do us a huge favour too! Lieutenant Commander Ian Chudley (father of Adela in Year 5) is a Senior Pilot with 849 Naval Air Squadron, Culdrose, Helston. He will be landing his Royal Navy Sea King helicopter here on the Friday prior to Armed Forces Day (where his Sea King will be one of the attractions). Lt Cdr Chudley will land in Devonport High School for Girls playing field (as there's not enough clear space on our playgrounds to do so). We'll be able to take some pupils over to watch the landing and also to have a look around the helicopter and meet the crew. What a fantastic opportunity!



A huge 'thank you' goes out from us to Lt Cdr Chudley for offering us and then organising this pretty unique event. Speaking to Adela today, she's very excited about Daddy landing his helicopter here especially as she won't be seeing him for a couple of weeks beforehand as he is going on detachment prior to the visit.
