This week, we were involved in a Teaching & Learning Review. This process is conducted by the Multi Academy Trust (MAT) and mirrors a full Ofsted Inspection. Its purpose is to provide the MAT with an accurate predication of the potential outcome of our next Ofsted inspection in order that they can support the school in its ongoing improvement efforts. The school review was conducted by the MAT Regional Director, an External Advisor and a local Headteacher. They closely scrutinised all of the areas ordinarily focussed on by an inspection team: this includes the quality & standards of education, effectiveness of leadership & management, the quality of teaching & learning, the personal development, behaviour & welfare of pupils, the outcomes for pupils, and the effectiveness of our early years provision (our reception classes). We're very proud to say that they judged us to be GOOD across the board. They were very impressed with the staff, pupils and governors and we received some extremely positive feedback from the team. I hope to share extracts with you once we have been provided with the report.
