Deputy Headteacher News

As a school we are constantly reflecting on our practise: reading, researching, trialling and adapting to first and foremost ensure that your children receive quality first teaching and learning. I would like to ask that as parents and carers that you take a moment, to reinforce with your children, the importance of school and education. Free School Meals, Service Children and Looked After Children

If you think you may be entitled to claim free school meals because of your income or circumstances it's essential you apply, even if your child is aged 4 to 7 and qualifies for Universal Free School Meals. This is because funding is granted to schools, based on the number of their pupils who are entitled to receive these free meals. For every pupil entitled to claim free school meals as a benefit, the school receives extra funding. This money is used in a variety of creative and innovative ways to help support individual pupils and the whole school community.

The school also receives extra money for:

- Children eligible for free school meals currently or during the past six years
- Children with parents currently serving in the armed forces
- Children in care and adopted children

It's really important that if your child is **ever** eligible for free school meals (however briefly) you should claim. For each eligible child, the school receives funding for the next six years, even if their parents go back to full-time well paid work! Children may be eligible if their parents/carers are receiving Income Support, Child Tax Credit, Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment Support Allowance.

If you are unsure then please contact the school office for guidance or advice. FSM forms are available from main reception — even if your child does not intend taking a lunch then the school can still benefit financially.

Service Personnel

Please notify school a.s.a.p. if you work in the armed forces or your child been in care or adopted.

There is a tight deadline as we have to complete a census by the end of next week or we lose the funding.
