Deputy Headteacher News

Montpelier is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for children, staff and visitors and promoting a climate where children and adults will feel confident about sharing any concerns which they may have about their own safety or the well-being of others. We aim to safeguard and promote the welfare of our children at all times. One aspect of this extends our school and becomes a collective responsibility of the community.

We have received information that a pupil has been approached by an unknown adult male at the DHSG bus stop on Outland Road. It has been made apparent that the contact was inappropriate with a view to the questions that were asked. The presence of intruders and suspicious strangers seen loitering near the school or approaching pupils, will be reported to the Police (using 101 or 999, depending on the circumstances and the urgency of the case) so that the police are aware of these individuals and can act accordingly. I urge anyone who has information or witnesses a circumstance that makes you feel uncomfortable, in connection to the information above, to contact the police at the earliest convenience.

Now a plea for me

The following is a direct quote from This Morning: Across the country, today, there are children spending the day in fear. Too frightened to go to school. Too frightened to speak out. Too frightened to tell anyone. Across the country, today, children are being bullied. As part of 'This Morning's Be Kind' campaign we want you to watch this video. You'll hear from two mums whose children took their own lives as a result of the bullying they Wed 24th May 2017 experienced. Then hit the pledge button. Pledge to watch this video with your children. Pledge to help your children know they can ask for help, for them to know someone cares and for them to know how important it is to BE KIND.

For my part, following my piece in the Beacon last week, I feel we all have a duty to do as has been asked and BE KIND. It has come to my attention that a number of our children are bringing in a homemade substance they are referring to as 'slime'. My understanding is the number one ingredient of this is a chemical based washing liquid or fabric softener. Finally, it has been observed throughout this term that a number of colourful additions have been making their way into the uniform that the children are wearing, most notably trainers, brightly coloured nails (in some cases these have been artificial) and hair accessories, in a variety of colours, that are ever increasing in size. I would like to refer you to our uniform policy that states:

Hair bands/ribbons should be plain and in school colours.

Children should wear shoes and NOT trainers to and from school and during the school day. The appropriate footwear for P.E. and games is indicated below. 'Fashion' shoes and trainers, i.e. large tongues, multi coloured laces, high ankle shoes/boots are not acceptable in any circumstances.




Year 1 News
