

Y 3/4 girls Argyle after school club

There are a few places still available for the Y 3/4 girls Argyle after school club, beginning on the Friday after Easter.If interested, please see Mr Robinson for a form or complete the one attached and send it in to him as soon as possible. Plymouth Argyle Football in the Community Trust is delighted to be holding an After School Club at Montpelier Primary School (3.15pm-4.15pm) for Year ¾ Girls on Fridays, After Easter. The course will run for 6 weeks commencing on Friday 26 th April and will finish on Friday 7th June (Friday after half-term). The cost would usually be £21, however, the school are requesting a contribution of £5 for the entire 6 week block of sessions. Forms must be completed and handed to Mr Robinson in 4P. No money is required yet, as this letter is just an expression of interest. Children will be informed if they have been successful in obtaining a place on the course after Wednesday, 27 th March, which is the deadline for handing in this letter. A random draw will be made to decide; however, if interest is high, the school may run another ¾ girls club in June-July. All of the children who attend the course should have a parent/guardian collect them after each session. Children will need to bring with them trainers, shin pads, and a drink. They are allowed to wear proper football kit (such as a team) if they wish, or alternatively normal school PE kit. Our coaches are CRB checked, hold a UEFA coaching qualification and have Emergency First Aid Training. Big Pedal 2019 (1st April - 5th April 2019)

Dear Parents/Carers.

Get set... we're taking part in the **Big Pedal 2019**, the UK's largest inter-school cycling and scooting challenge that inspires pupils, staff and parents to choose two wheels for their journey to school. It's free to enter and we would love everyone to be involved.

The details

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils, staff and parents cycling or scooting to school. Our score from the five days will determine our final position in the challenge. We'll be competing against other schools right across the UK. If we clock up the most bike and scooter journeys we'll win! We are also going to have an in school competition, with a great prize for the class with the highest number of active journeys. Teachers, parents, siblings and pupils scores all count so find your bikes and scooters!

Big Pedal Breakfast

To reward active travellers there will be a special Big Pedal breakfast of pancakes, waffles and fruit for anyone that travels actively to school on a bike or scooter on Thursday 4th April between 8-8:30 am. The breakfast will take place in the KS1 playground. All bikes and scooters will need to be left in the KS1 playground everyday! There will be signed areas to use. It is important bikes are stored at these specific points so children can quickly access their bikes/scooters throughout the week, as they will all have the chance to take part in skills challenges. When children are taking part in the obstacle course a bicycle helmet MUST be worn even if the children are on scooters! It is important that the correct message is given to children that helmets save lives and it only takes a second for an accident to happen however big or small. (We do have some in school but not enough for everyone). Children without bikes or scooters will be able to take part on foot.

Obstacle Course

Throughout the week, the children will be able to take part in the famous Montpelier obstacle course. On Wednesday, the Sustrans team will be in to organise a special course for everybody and throughout the week the will be course set up for classes to use!

What's next?

All you need to do is encourage your child or children to cycle or scoot to school every day during the event, and join them on their way. If you live far away, you could always park close to school and actively travel in from there. Please make sure that your child's bike or scooter is clearly labelled! If any bikes/scooters are left behind in the playground the school will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

For the first time, walking will be counted alongside cycling and scooting. This year the challenge will run from 25 March - 5 April. How it works On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils, staff and parents cycling, walking, scooting or using a wheelchair to school. A school's best five days will determine their final position and schools at the top of their leaderboards will receive an exclusive Sustrans Big Pedal Trophy. All schools will be entered into daily prize draws for rewards if over 15% of your school cycle, walk or scoot on each day of the challenge. These free resources include: A school account on the Big Pedal website A human body wallchart with curriculum-based fact cards Daily classroom activities Posters Top Tips Leaderboards **FAQs** Who can take part in the Big Pedal 2019? All schools and classes in the UK can take part in the Big Pedal A school must register online on the Big Pedal website. You will need your school identification number (DtE/SEED/Inst Ref Number) and the details of a staff representative who will be responsible for entering journeys throughout the challenge. Schools can register any time ahead of the challenge. How do I register? Yes. There is a list of schools that have registered on the website which you can search for alphabetically, by school name or Local Authority. You can also view a map of schools taking part. Can I see which schools in my area are taking part? For schools unable to record five days worth of journeys over the challenge full challenge, can we still take part? weeks, we also have a one-day version, which can include cycling, walking and scooting activities in the school day as well as on the journey to school. We are a Special Educational Needs (SEN), can we compete? Yes, SEN schools can compete too. If your pupils are able to cycle, walk, scoot or use a wheelchair to school then you may enter the Sustrans Big Pedal just like any other school and count your journeys. There is no separate category for SEN schools. However, SEN schools with pupils who are unable to scoot./cycle to school may use school/static/adapted blikes and count journeys made at school, e.g. during school break times, in the playground.
