



We are very excited that World Book Day is almost here.

Polar Bear Explorer

Have you become a Polar Bear Explorer yet? Polar Bears need our help and they've brought an important message to Plymouth this winter. 20 Polar Bear cubs have been let loose across Plymouth's Waterfront and they're hiding in Sutton Harbour, The Barbican, Hoe, Millbay and Royal William Yard until March 3rd.

Each cub has a Bear Fact with them, telling us about the Arctic and the oceans, how plastic is affecting their home and how we can all help.
