Headteacher's Comment

As you will know, Montpelier is part of the ISP (Inspiring Schools Partnership, Multi-Academy Trust - MAT) along with Stoke Damerel Community College and Scott Medical & Healthcare College. MATs are charities established to undertake a strategic collaboration to improve and maintain high educational standards across a number of schools (in our case, that's currently three). The MAT has overarching responsibility for the governance of these schools. It is accountable for the performance of each one in the group, and of the group as a whole. Each school still has its own Local Governing Body (LGB) which operates subject to agreed delegation of powers. The reason I tell you all this is that the ISP MAT is currently looking for new Trustees. These are a group of people who operate in a broadly similar way to our school governors but they oversee the MAT as a whole. They have a number of duties/responsibilities relating to the governance of the Trust and its finances. Amongst others things, they establish the vision, mission and values for the Trust. They design strategy and structure for the Trust's operation. They ensure/oversee the financial controls and the financial management, set standards of conduct and values, monitor performance and achievement, and ensure plans for improvement are acted upon. Currently the Board of Trustees are seeking individuals with specific skill-sets to join them. Anyone who is interested in finding out more about the role, and has a background in either commerce, or the legal or finance profession, please contact the school main reception. There will be commitment to attend main Trustee meetings (four or five a year) and a committee (another four or five meetings). These are usually about 2 hours in duration in late afternoon/early evening with some associated reading of documents beforehand. You will also be expected to familiarise yourself with the three ISP schools. In return, you have the opportunity to contribute to the success of three key educational establishments within the city of Plymouth which can be a very rewarding role. The Trustees also need a new Clerk to provide administrative support, advice on governance, constitutional and procedural matters, and to manage information for them. 
Year 2 and 3 Choir- last rehearsal is Tues 12th June
