Academy Conversion

On Tuesday of last week, the Board of Governors received a letter from the Rt Hon Nicky Morgan MP (Secretary of State for Education) which informed us of her consent for Montpelier to convert to an academy and provided us with the Academy Order that we needed in order to proceed with the process. You may have realised that this presents a slight delay as we had aimed to convert for the start of this summer term. However, the application process to convert took longer than anticipated as the DfE is not only finding the number of current applications a challenge to process but are also remaining highly selective in approving applications. Montpelier, Stoke Damerel Community College and their studio school (Scott Medical & Health College) really had to securely demonstrate how our partnership would benefit each school and the pupils and students within them.

Having received the Academy Order, the Montpelier Board of Governors then met on Wednesday of this week to consider all representations made from stakeholders throughout the consultation period before finally taking the decision whether or not to proceed with the conversion. I can happily inform you that the Board unanimously agreed to proceed with our conversion. Montpelier will become an academy in the coming few months. There remains one final delay to us finalising an actual date, and that is an agreement with the Local Authority (Plymouth City Council - PCC) regarding the school buildings. As an academy, we will take on all the responsibility and liabilities for the school buildings and grounds. Montpelier school, being of post-war construction, has a few issues and it is very important that the Board of Governors establishes and agrees its current condition with PCC prior to hand-over. Once this agreement has been reached, our conversion date will be finalised. I will keep you informed of developments.

As I have mentioned previously, this represents a change mainly at a strategic school organisation and management level rather than anything that will directly affect the children day to day. If you haven't found an opportunity to read the information regarding the conversion that is available on our website, please do take a few minutes to do so - there's a lot of detail within it but it's worth the read (www.montpelierprimary.co.uk/website/academy). There's a variety of information to look through so you can choose how informed you want to be; just get a general picture or know every detail - it's up to you.

What is important to know is that, as stated in the original letter I sent out, any change we pursue is only ever to further improve the school. When we finally convert, the school name, our logo and the uniform will not change. Montpelier will remain as a non-selective, local, state-funded primary school for the children in this area. And, although we are entering into a collaborative partnership with Stoke Damerel Community College, it will not - in any way - curtail our pupils' options regarding their choice of secondary school. We actually see this as an opportunity to further improve transition arrangements into all the secondary schools we feed into. The strategic benefits will come in the form of shared governance, leadership, management systems, staffing, finances, purchasing, contracts, service provision, procurement, etc. All those things that go on in the background and are crucial to the running of the school but which are rarely evident to you or the children.

Hair Cut Fundraiser


