Social Media Accounts

There are numerous online mobile photo-sharing, video-sharing and social networking services that enable their users to take pictures and videos, and share them on a variety of social networking platforms. I would like to bring to your attention that the minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, oovoo, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, and Snapchat is 13. YouTube requires account holders to be 18, but a 13-year-old can sign up with a parent's permission. However, we are finding that many of our older pupils are actively using them and issues caused by the use of them are impacting on school life. We do as part of the curriculum focus on keeping safe online and discuss and demonstrate appropriate conduct when using the internet. The children have been also been advised, on more than one occasion, that they are not currently of the appropriate age to hold any such account. In an ideal world, I would ask all parents to adhere to the age restrictions recommended by the developers. Failing that, I wish to respectfully request that all parents carefully monitor their children's use of any social networking sites and/or content sharing apps to avoid issues of cyberbullying and inappropriate content. We always proactively work to address such issues in school but tackling this at home will help immeasurably.


Bikes, Scooters and Safety.

I am very conscious that I may start to sound like a broken record, but I feel that a reminder of our expectations regarding the use of bikes and scooters on the school grounds is required at this time. During my walks around the school grounds in the morning and after school I have noticed an increasing number of children riding around the school grounds. Safety on the school site is of paramount importance to us. We have asked, in various ways, that pupils do not ride bikes or scooters around the school grounds. We love the idea of them using bikes and scooters to come to and from school; we strongly encourage this in fact. What we MUST have though is children dismounting and walking with their bike or scooter whilst on the school playgrounds. We have had too many collisions and minor accidents due to children charging around busy playgrounds at the beginning and end of the day.

Year 4 News

Another brilliant week in year 4. In Maths, the children have been looking at and investigating data, presenting it using a variety of graphs. Year 5 News

This week, some of the children have been attending events outside of school. On Wednesday, The Stock Market Challenge involved pupils trying to make as much money as they could and our team made almost £50,000! Unfortunately not enough to win the competition. Yesterday a selection of children attended The Big Bang a science afternoon where the children could experience scientific workshops and try interesting things.

In class the children have been enjoying fractions, decimals and percentages in Maths and English the children completed their non-chronological report.

Illness

The school should be notified on the first day of absence, for whatever reason, for a child's absence. We are charged by legislation to show the number of absences from school for the preceding academic year and these will be included on your child's annual report. All absences must be accounted for by letter, telephone Please expect a or in person. call/text from one of our Administrators if we do not receive a call explaining the absence first thing on that first day. There is a dedicated absence answer-phone so messages can be left 24 hours a day. If your child has had diarrhoea or has been vomiting in the past 24 hours, please keep him/her at home until the child has been symptom-free for 48 hours.

If your child is experiencing itchy, watery eyes (often symptoms of conjunctivitis), please keep your child home until the condition has improved (no pus or crusting) and treatment has begun.

If your child exhibits an unexplained skin rash, again please keep your child home until the condition has been evaluated and treated. E.g. impetigo - lesions must be crusted or healed, no wetness or pus. For chickenpox – all blisters must be crusted; period of exclusion from school is a minimum of 5 days from the onset of the rash.

Threadworm

Just to inform you that we have had a couple of cases of threadworm reported to us. The usual incubation period is 2 – 6 weeks. Children very often complain of an itchy bottom – especially at night time. Prevention relies on good hygiene, especially washing of hands after using the toilet and before eating or preparing food. Sucking fingers or biting nails is to be discouraged.

Treatment can be bought at the chemist or obtained from the doctor on prescription.
