#### Note to Parents:

The teachers would appreciate it if the children's P.E kits could be left in school, labelled and in a clearly marked P.E bag. The children can keep their P.E kits in school on their pegs and you are welcome to take them home for washing as it suits you. Please note that jewellery is limited to stud earrings and watches only. Due to health & safety, during PE they should be removed.

All of year 3 share the same days for their PE lessons this year. They will be on a **Tuesday** (Indoor) and **Wednesday** (Outdoor) afternoon.

We often find that jumpers and coats go missing. We encourage the children to put them on their own pegs, but it is extremely helpful to have the **child's** <u>name clearly</u> <u>visible</u> in their clothes so that it can be passed on, if found elsewhere.

#### Homework:

In Year 3, homework will usually be sent home weekly on a Friday and is expected to be returned to the class teacher by the following Thursday. The Year 3 staff would appreciate it if you could spend some time supporting your child with their homework each week as we feel this benefits their progress. For any children where their homework is not completed, a homework club will take place on a Friday lunchtime that they will attend to complete what hasn't been done.

Our homework covers a range of English and Maths activities that reinforce work in class. Occasionally topic work may be the homework focus, but this will be clearly explained to your child and to yourself.

In addition spelling will be sent out on a Tuesday. Your child should practice spelling these words both on their own as well as within a sentence. These spellings will then be tested on the following Monday.

#### Contributions from home:

Your support is invaluable and really does make a difference to your child's learning. This term we would particularly welcome help with certain activities that we will inform you of throughout the term.

## <u>Supporting Readers:</u>

If you are able to come in and listen to children read it would be a great help.

Please contact your child's teacher if you would like to support reading in the class, or if you would like to help with something else that is going on this term.

### Experiences / visits / visitors:
