#### **Headteacher News**

## Golden Time = Golden Learning Time

There's been some changes this week regarding Golden Time which I'm sure children have told many of you about already. Golden Time is becoming Golden Learning Time and we have introduced a new way of rewarding the expected good behaviour. Golden Time was introduced many years ago as a way of rewarding those children who remain on 'Green' throughout the week – in our behaviour policy, green is described as: 'Good behaviour, courteous, respectful and on task. Following agreed rules and routines' – basically, the everyday expected good behaviour of children. Whilst merely an expectation (as it should be) we still choose to reward children for doing this. However, rewarding children through 'Golden Time' is not an effective use of their time in school. They have timetabled opportunities for unstructured play with their friends and using valuable curriculum time for us to give them a bit more of this, is something we can no longer justify. We have therefore introduced Golden Learning Time which sees Friday afternoons being set aside for reviewing and celebrating the learning that has taken place during the week, for addressing any areas of misconception, and for setting the tone to prepare for the nest week's learning. A much better use of curriculum time we think you'll agree.

Obviously we still wish to reward our 'always good' children and we have chosen to do this by giving every 'Green' achieved each day an entry into a prize draw for a fun activity towards the end of each half term. The more 'Greens' achieved, the higher the probability of their name being drawn out to receive that prize. This half term, 30 names will be drawn (equally from across each class) to go to Pizza Express for a morning to find out about and to make their own pizzas. True, not every child will be rewarded as they are through Golden Time now but then this is about rewarding behaviour that should be there anyway and also about making the most of their learning time whilst they're in school. Going for Gold – our approach to celebrating exceptional behaviour remains the same. Changes like this sometimes take a bit of getting used to but hopefully you'll all understand the reasons why we think the change is necessary.

## **Age Restrictions Matter**

The minimum age to open an account on social networking sites such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, TumbIr and Snapchat is 13. For Vine, Tinder and Yik Yak it's 17. YouTube requires account holders to be 18, but a 13-year-old can sign up with a parent's permission. Despite these clearly stated and published age restrictions, large and growing numbers of children aged 11 and under are using social media networks, often with their parent's knowledge and consent.

Social media has many benefits. It connects you with others, you can meet new people, it can help you find old friends, lost relatives, and so much more. However, with it comes a far more sinister side. This is about protecting your child from potential online abuse, sexual predators, cyber-crimes and other digital issues that they may not be prepared to handle at their young age. Yes, you may feel that they are mature enough to have a Facebook or Instagram account but it's the others online that you need to be concerned about. Age restrictions and privacy policies are put in place for the protection of children. Even if 'all their friends are on it', as a responsible parent, you must exercise your duty of care for them.
