

Current Practical Arrangements for Remote Learning From January 2022

- If your child is off due to C19 isolation but is well enough to learn, they can access remote learning.
- Year groups 1 to 6 are requested to continue with their ongoing times tables/number practice homework, their spelling work (making use of Spelling Shed) and also reading.
- There will also be a Remote Learning folder in their class' Google Classroom. This will contain a page of useful website links that your child can access for additional learning.
- The folder will also contain the half term's homework challenges. Your child can select challenges from this sheet to complete while they are at still at home.
- Year 6 pupils also have their SATs packs.
- Any work that your child completes while they are absent can be brought back to school on their return for marking.
- Children in the Foundation Classes will be able to access the usual home learning in Tapestry. We appreciate that our youngest children struggle to access home learning without the support of parents and that each home situation is different. If you are wanting more ideas to support your child at home at this time then please do contact the school office.
- The Department for Education are expecting children from Foundation and KS1 to complete 3 hours of home learning a day and those in KS2 to complete 4 hours a day.
- The circumstances for each child being off and the actual number of school days missed when they are well enough to learn will vary considerably. Therefore, we would ask parents to let us know if they need additional support with remote learning or with pupil support.
