Deputy Headteacher's Comment

Why road safety matters - Montpelier recently supported the big pedal – an initiative to encourage children to be active and engage in alternatives methods on transport when coming into school. Part of our duty alongside this is to educate the children about road safety and why it matters. Our school site is in the heart of a residential area. This area is extremely busy at the beginning and the end of the day with over 1000 people entering or leaving the site on foot, bike or car at any one time.

Statistics indicate that the number of children aged 5-7 killed or seriously injured on the roads has decreased by 19% since 2010 (which is fantastic news). However, 73% of those killed or seriously injured were on foot at the time. A further 20% were killed or seriously injured as car passengers and 5% as cyclists. Alarmingly research shows 8% of 5-9 year olds were not restrained at all when travelling in the rear of vehicles and that most children under 9 can't judge how fast vehicles are going or how far away they are.

How else you can help? - Explain to your child why they need to stop, look and listen when crossing the road. Talk about safer places to cross and how it's harder to see where there are parked cars, junctions, bends or the brow of a hill. Help your child to learn the names of the different crossings, such as zebras, puffins, pelicans and footbridges. Follow these steps with your child every time you cross the road.
