#### **Headteacher News**

You may recall that in the Beacon dated 5<sup>th</sup> May Mr Holland made reference to the Learning Behaviours that form the fabric of daily life here at our school. For your reference the piece is below:

**Golden Learning Behaviours** 

You will hopefully remember that we introduced the idea of Golden Learning Behaviours (GLB) back in the spring term of 2016. GLB grew from our 'Going for Gold' initiative that began in the summer of 2014. Going for Gold recognises children who are always good and, particularly, those who go 'above and beyond' in terms of their behaviour. Since we began celebrating outstanding behaviour in this way, it has improved even further right across the school, despite already being a great strength of ours. Pupils demonstrate lovely behaviour and also encourage and expect it of each other. Golden Learning Behaviours followed on from this. It aimed to recognise, celebrate and encourage excellent learning behaviours and to openly teach children to become better learners. This isn't about studying new facts or building on knowledge so that the children know more 'stuff'. It's about techniques, skills and abilities the children need and (most importantly) can develop further, in order to become better at learning new things. What we've done now is simplify the model we were using. Previously, we'd closely followed a nationally recognised initiative called Building Learning Power. However, in using it, we found that it was very complex; having four main learning dispositions and then 17 'learning muscles' within these dispositions. It was all a little too complicated. So, what we've done is to strip it back a bit and personalise it for Montpelier and the children we have here. We now have just 7 broad golden learning behaviours that we develop in school. These are: love learning, love a challenge, persevere, believe in ourselves, value teamwork, focus, and develop self-help strategies. There's lots of key language and skills that sit behind these | Tues 5<sup>th</sup> Sept 2017 learning behaviours and I encourage you to visit our website to find out a little more about this: (www.montpelierprimary.co.uk/website/golden learning behaviour).

It's much simpler for the children to understand this way and it is also much more pertinent to the approach to learning that we value at Montpelier.

What we have at Montpelier is a notion that children will understand and immerse themselves in the culture that is being promoted. A direct consequence of building an understanding of the learning behaviours is to ultimately create lifelong learners that make a positive contribution to the world - thus enabling children to respond with confidence and conviction to the question 'what makes a good learner'?

Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> June saw our children take full part in the first (and I hope of many) Golden Learning Behaviour Day. The children worked in collaboration with children across the whole school, building new relationships and enhancing existing ones. Hopefully you will have heard all about it by the time you read this week's Beacon, but what I can add is that it was a privilege to have been part of such a wonderful event. My thanks go out to the team at Montpelier for going above and beyond, once again, for our children. The time, thought and preparation that went into organising the day was incredible and contributed to the success of the whole occasion. I had a fantastic day and I am sure the children did too – it will most definitely be one they remember for many years to come.
