Golden Learning Behaviour

Most of you will probably remember that we introduced Going for Gold back in the summer of 2014 which aimed to recognise all those children who are always good and to more openly celebrate all those pupils that behave so well throughout the school. Since then, behaviour – which was already a great strength of the school – has improved even further. There remains a very small minority of pupils whose behaviour is sometimes unacceptable but they are an ever decreasing minority now thanks to the childrens' ongoing efforts to demonstrate great behaviour and to encourage and expect it of each other. Following the ongoing success of Going for Gold, we have started to introduce Golden Learning Behaviour. This aims to recognise, celebrate and encourage excellent learning behaviours and to openly teach children to become better learners. This isn't about studying new facts or building on knowledge so that the children know more 'stuff'. It's about techniques, skills and abilities the children need and (most importantly) can develop further, in order to become better at learning new things.

Golden Learning Behaviour is broken up into four key areas (or dispositions): the 4 R's (which is based on Professor Guy Claxton's 'Building Learning Power'): Resilience, Resourcefulness, Reflectiveness and Reciprocity. These four learning dispositions are further broken down into seventeen different aspects of learning (or 'learning muscles'): Managing Distractions, Perseverance, Absorption, Noticing, Questioning, Making Links, Imagining, Reasoning, Capitalising, Planning, Revising, Distilling, Meta-Learning, Collaboration, Imitation, Empathy/Listening and Interdependence. By teaching children about these learning muscles and how to become better at doing each of them, we will be able to develop them into more effective learners – able to take on new things and develop their skills, abilities, knowledge and understanding much more effectively. There's lots here that's new to the children so we will be introducing this gradually over time. Although the words used to describe the learning muscles are tricky, you will hopefully hear the children starting to use them when they talk about their learning at home. The first disposition being introduced is 'Resilience'. In order for the children to find it easier to remember, we have created characters. Resilient Robbie is the Zoo Keeper who looks after Managing Distractions Monkey, Persevering Penguin, Absorbing Alligator and Noticing Newt. Managing Distractions is all about recognising and reducing distractions; knowing when to walk away and refresh yourself and also creating your own best learning environment. Perseverance is about keeping going in the face of difficulties, channelling the energy of frustration productively - knowing what a slow and uncertain process learning often is. Absorption is about being able to lose yourself in learning - becoming absorbed in what you are doing; rapt and attentive, in a state of 'flow'. Noticing is being able to perceive subtle nuances, patterns and details in experience. These are all attributes we already use when learning but our aim is to more overtly recognise, identify, celebrate and encourage them and then begin to teach children how to become more proficient at each of them.
