#### **Diary Dates Headteacher News** Thurs 15<sup>th</sup> June 2017 Mixing of Classes – A Questions and Answers Session – Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June at 5:00pm. Class S & Year 5 Class photos We sent a letter out to all parents on 21<sup>st</sup> April, explaining that we have introduced a new Proms in the Playground approach to how classes are organised for the start of Year 1, Year 3 and Year 5. It explained 6-7pm that from now onwards, at the end of their Foundation Stage year with us, we will review the Mon 19<sup>th</sup> June 2017 three classes and create three new class mixes for the start of Year 1. Also, we will review the Race for Life event classes at the end of Year 2 and Year 4, with the intention of adjusting their composition for Wed 21<sup>st</sup> June 2017 the start of Years 3 and 5 respectively. The purpose behind this new approach is to create Yr 2 – Trip to Wembury balanced classes based upon the characteristics that are proven to impact upon academic Mon 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2017 achievement, such as: gender, ability, language acquisition, absence levels, behaviour, date of Foundation & KS1 Sports birth, special educational need and social background. There are currently classes with a disproportionate number of children who have, for example, social, emotional, and/or Day behavioural needs and this can have a significant impact on the class dynamic.
