Year 6—Secondary School Deadline


Reminder—parents are asked to submit their secondary school preference forms by the deadline of 31 October 2019 please.

The annual PSSP Championships Cross Country got underway yesterday at Staddiscombe. With eight races in total the 1200 plus runners arrived ready to take on the challenging course. Montpelier was fortunate enough to enter in all 'Major' categories with another 16 schools. First up was the year 3 and 4 girls finishing in 1st position, with over 70 runners all 6 of our athletes finished in the top 23 and selected to compete in the Devon Winter Games next year. The year 3 and 4 boys and 5 and 6 girls unfortunately didn't make the top 4. Final race of the day were the year 5 and 6 boys, waiting for their overall position, just missed out on 3rd by 2 points but still qualified for the Devon Games.
