Keeping safe online at Christmas – Facebook Live with Roblox on 16 December

Many of your children will be spending time online this Christmas, and some will be fortunate enough to receive gifts of new devices or games. I encourage the positive use of technology and understand its role in fun and learning – at school and at home. But there are risks to all online activity, so I would like to tell you about an opportunity to find out more.

On 16th December at 7.30pm there will be a free Facebook Live session that will cover what to watch out for, top tips for staying safe, parental controls you can set and forget, and the opportunity to ask questions.

The Facebook live session can be found using this link <u>safechristmas.lgfl.net</u>.

The event will be run by experts in the DigiSafe team at LGfL and will also feature a special guest from the game Roblox which many of our pupils play.

I encourage you to attend this event from the comfort of your home before you wrap up those shiny new devices or games – it's a lot less stressful to change settings before Christmas morning – or before your children start the holidays and want to spend time online.

Please also remember before buying Christmas presents that games have age ratings linked to their content, not their difficulty (games are rated 18 for the same reasons as films - inappropriate language, sex and violence).

There are plenty of great reasons to make technology part of your Christmas, so remember to talk about positives with your child – one great way to find out what they do online and also have fun together is to ask them to show you what they do and to teach you to play their games.

Finally, if you need general help and support over the holidays:

Dentist & Doctor's Appointments

Can we ask parents that, except in an emergency, all doctor and dentist appointments are made outside of school hours. In the event that this is not possible, then children should be collected from school as near to the appointment time as possible and then returned back to school straight afterwards. If the medical appointment is during the school day, evidence must be provided. A whole days absence is not deemed necessary for a medical appointment that occurs in the morning – the child would be expected to return to school in the afternoon, and vice versa.

Staff Car Park

May we remind parents that the car park in North Down Road is for STAFF ONLY. As such the gate will be locked at 8:30am each morning. We would also like to remind parents that they should keep to the pedestrian areas around the carpark and not walk across the carpark itself.

Holiday Requests

In these first few weeks we have received an astonishing number of requests for holiday to be taken during term time. Whilst we appreciate and to some degree understand the reasons given, we have found it difficult signing the authorisations under the new criteria dictated by the authority. We can only authorise holidays where there are **exceptional** circumstances eg service families or for a religious celebration/occasion. If it is your employer's policy to only permit holidays at a specific time then please submit a supporting letter from them. We would strongly request that parents/carers seriously consider the implications before booking a holiday (holidays should not be booked until signed authorisation has been received back from school). Absence during term time does have a detrimental effect on the education of children. Schemes of work are rigorously planned by teachers to ensure appropriate development and continuity for the class. Breaks in the delivery of the teaching means children miss out on crucial elements of the curriculum and are at a disadvantage when compared to their peers.

Why is it important for children not to miss school?

If children do not attend school regularly, they may not be able to keep up with school work. In a busy school day it is difficult for schools to find the extra time to help a child catch up. And it's not only the academic work: missing out on the social side of school life – especially at primary school – can affect children's ability to make and keep friendships, a vital part of growing up.

Setting good attendance patterns from an early age, from nursery classes through primary school, will also help your child later on. Employers want to recruit people who are reliable. So children who have a poor school attendance record may have less chance of getting a good job.

Being on time is also vital. Arriving late at school can be very disruptive for your child, the teacher, and the other children in the class. Children coming into school late need to sign in at the school office and indicate their lunch choice.

Timings

Some parents may find it hard to get their children to attend school – let the school know. As well as the Class Teacher, SENCO, Head Teacher etc we also have a Parent Support Adviser, Jane Gilbert (Telephone: 07894 <u>596204 or email</u> <u>janegilbert@montpelier.plymouth.sch.uk</u>).

Research has shown that children who are not in school are most vulnerable and are easily drawn into crime. Those children who play truant are more likely to offend than those that do not. In primary schools less than 65% get good results in Maths and English in schools with an average of 15 days absence compared to around 90% in schools where the average is less than 8 days. Many parents are surprised how quickly their children accumulate 15 days absence. Every lesson in school matters - children who have time off find it difficult to catch up. The school must be notified on the first day of absence, for whatever reason, for a child's absence. We are charged by legislation to show the number of absences from school for the preceding academic year and these will be included on your child's annual report. All absences must be accounted for by letter, telephone or in person. If we do not receive notification from you then please expect a call from us sometime during that first day. Parents of children with persistent absence may also receive a letter requesting medical evidence for all future absence – i.e. a doctor's appointment card, prescribed medication or doctor's note/letter. Any absence without this proof will be recorded as unauthorised.
