Hello from Mr West

As we approach the penultimate week of the first autumn term I took a little time to reflect on what we have, as a school community, achieved so far this academic year. As parents and carers you will be aware of all the adjustments that have been made to our school provision to allow us to welcome back all of our children and fulfil our duty to provide an education to the children in our care.

We are all too aware that exposure to COVID-19 is an inherent risk in any public location where people are present and have established practices to put limitations on the risk of transmission. I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that we are and will continue to operate within these COVID-19 procedures for the foreseeable.

Free School Meal

If you receive certain benefits, you may be entitled to claim free school meals. Plymouth City Council is able to check your eligibility online, therefore minimising the need to provide proof of your entitlement.

It is of great benefit for our school if you are entitled to free school meals as we could receive extra school funding for all children who qualify.

Even if your child is aged 4 to 7, and would qualify for Universal Free School Meals, we would encourage you to register for free-school-meals, if you think that you may be entitled under any of the benefits.

Registering for Pupil Premium funding could raise an extra £1,345 for your child's primary school, to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities.

Reminder – parents need to submit their preference forms by the deadline of 31st October 2020. Please, wherever possible, apply online, it is quick and easy – all you need is an email address. 2021 Service Pupil Premium

Extra Funding for State Schools, Free Schools and Academies attended by Service Children in England

Service parents with children in State maintained schools, Free schools and Academies in England are encouraged to ensure that the Head Teacher of their child(ren)'s school is made aware of their Service status ahead of the Spring school census deadline of 21 January 2021.

The Service Pupil Premium is provided by the Department for Education to State maintained schools, Free schools and Academies in England who have children of Regular Armed Forces personnel among their pupil population to provide

additional (mainly pastoral) support. Pupils with a parent on full commitment as part of the Full Time Reserve Service (FTRS FC) are also classed as Service children.

Service Pupil Premium is currently £310.00 per Service pupil and is paid directly to schools.

Schools with Service children in Reception to Year 11 classes are eligible to receive the funding, but only if the child(ren)'s name appears on the school's roll as being a Service child.

The information recorded by schools regarding Service status is protected and data regarding individual children is not shared outside the school.

Never Such Innocence

Never Such Innocence have just launched their 2020/21 creative arts competition! This year's competition theme is 'The Unheard Voices of Conflict: Stories from Around the World'. NSI wants young people to share their reflections on conflict or give a voice to those who may not have one. Some examples of an 'unheard voice' could include: a personal family story relating to conflict, the feelings of a service child who has a parent deployed or refugees fleeing from their homes.

The international competition features four categories: Poetry, Art, Speech and Song and is open to young people aged 9-18. Winners in the four categories will be invited to participate in unique experiences and will receive a special personalised certificate of commendation for their work.

Entering the competition is simple. All that is required is a digital entry form and picture / file upload of their work. Full competition details can be found on the NSI website. The deadline to enter is Friday 19th March 2021.
