This week Miss Clegg and I had the first meeting of our latest pupil voice group, The Zoo Team. We spent time meeting all the animals (apart from Bess) and thinking what we needed to know about them to find out more about how to look after them so that as a group we can ensure that we are looking after our 'zoo' as well as we can: Assistance Dog, Guinea Pigs, Chickens, Stick Insects, Goldfish, Tortoise. We started to think about what they all have in common in terms of the things that we need to give them and what a responsibility it is to have animals in school. I love our zoo. I love the additional sense of family and home it gives us, the opportunities for responsibility it gives and the awe and wonder too. Watching a child find a freshly laid egg is a magical experience. The children continue to be amazing in their training of Bess and being so patient when they just want to be with her. She does still have a little way to go though. She still jumps up when she is too excited and is currently going through a barking phase when she wants attention – I am not sure if we are still at the toddler stage or have moved straight on to teenager. However, every day she shows us how happy she is to be in school. She is relaxed, her tail wags all the time and she is eager to get walking around the corridors with me practising her lead walking and learning to sit, lie down, wait and come, even when there are distractions around her. I am sure that as parents you will empathise with me that the energy and patience it takes to keep working on consistent good behaviour and manners is exhausting, time consuming and often frustrating. However, it is so worth it!

I just wanted to let you know that we are looking at our various communication methods. We have so many ways to get in touch with you and I appreciate that it can be confusing as to where to find what. I had a brilliant chat with a lovely mum last year about this and how we can alter what we do. I was early days in my role here at the time so if it is you please come and remind me as would love to let you know where I have got to!

Friends and Families


